The Southern Health NHS Foundation Trust (SHFT) Public Health School Nurse Service work in partnership with the special schools.

How to contact your 0-19 Public Health School Nursing Service

If you wish to contact a SHFT School Nurse for advice you can do this using our text messaging service called ChatHealth 5-19. Parents and carers can text their query to a dedicated number, which a health professional will respond to within one working day. This text messaging service is an easy way for parents and carers to ask for help and information with a range of issues such as hearing, sleep, behaviour, transition to school. The support that we offer may include signposting you to other services, as necessary.

Text messages sent to the ChatHealth numbers will be charged at your normal call rate. The service is available from 9am – 4:30pm Monday -Thursday and 9am-4pm Friday (inclusive of school holidays excluding bank holidays.)

PiP Parent Information Portal

SHFT have launched a new parent information portal where you can have access to view your child's immunisations. In the near future parents will be able to view their child's National Child Measurement Programme [NCMP] results via the portal. Your child should have received their 2nd MMR and preschool booster before starting school. If these vaccines are still outstanding, please contact your GP to arrange an appointment to discuss having these vaccines prior to starting school.

The SHFT School-age Immunisation service will offer the nasal flu vaccine in school as part of the childhood flu programme. You will be contacted nearer the time with details which will include completing an electronic consent form. Please can you ensure that your child's contact details are up to date with your GP.
